RDCK DIRECTORS ATTEND 2019 UBCM CONVENTION

The 2019 UBCM (Union of BC Municipalities) Convention was held in Vancouver from September 23-27. The theme of the Convention was Resiliency and Change, and allowed local governments to discuss how to manage the local impact of complex issues and to find new approaches to plan and thrive. Eighteen RDCK Directors and the CAO attended the convention, during which they were kept busy with meetings, study sessions and networking events. The convention also gave Directors the opportunity to meet with provincial ministers and staff regarding issues within their communities. The Board's priorities going into UBCM were the Recycle BC Stewardship Plan and transition process; the HB Mines tailings storage facility; and the funding model for Health Authority capital budgets. The RDCK Board Chair, in partnership with RDKB and RDEK, also met with Ministers to request support for the continuation of the Kootenay-Boundary Farm Advisors Program as well as the expansion of the broadband network throughout the Kootenays and Boundary area.

LETTER OF SUPPORT: SELKIRK TECHNOLOGY ACCESS CENTRE – ADVANCED MANUFACTURING AND MATERIALS

The Board will send a letter in support of the Selkirk Technology Access Center (STAC) Advanced Manufacturing and Materials grant application to the Natural Science and Engineering Research Council of Canada's College and Community Innovation Program indicating the RDCK will provide an in-kind contribution of communications and marketing support equivalent to \$2,500 annually over a five-year period. A technology access centre is a centre affiliated with a Canadian college that provides access to specialized technology, equipment, and expertise to local industry with the goal of enhancing their productivity and innovation.

CRESTON VALLEY – KOOTENAY LAKE ECONOMIC ACTION PARTNERSHIP

The Board approved the Terms of Reference and the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Town of Creston and the Regional District of Central Kootenay for the Creston Valley Kootenay Lake Economic Action Partnership (CV-KL EAP). The CV-KL EAP is a strategic partnership aimed at looking for regional economic opportunities and challenges, and ways to address these in a collaborative way. The CV-KL EAP seeks to enact and build upon the "Stronger Together – Creston Valley – Kootenay Lake Economic Action Strategy." Directors Jackman, Wall and Casemore were authorized to sign the MOU on behalf of the RDCK. Factor 5 will provide community and economic development services for the CV-KL EAP to a maximum value of \$225,000, with the cost included in the Financial Plan for Service S108 Economic Development-Creston and Areas B and C.
