### VILLAGE OF NAKUSP

## BY-LAW No. 500-1

### PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA

A By-Law of the Village of Nakusp in the Province of British Columbia to amend the Waste Control By-Law No. 500 for the Village of Nakusp.

WHEREAS

The Village of Nakusp has enacted By-Law 500, the Waste Control By-Law for the Village, which Council now deems necessary to amend;

**NOW** 

THEREFORE

the Municipal Council of the Village of Nakusp in the Province of British

Columbia, duly assembled, hereby enacts as follows:

# TITLE

1. This By-Law shall be known as the Village of Nakusp Waste Control By-Law Amending By-Law No. 500-1.

## **AMENDMENT**

- 2. Waste Control By-Law No. 500 be amended as follows:
  - -Section II, Definitions, change definition of "Non-Residential Receptacle" to read as follows:
  - "... a metal bin, having a capacity of one cubic metre or more, used or intended to be used at a commercial, industrial, institutional or other non-residential premise; and which is compatible to and operable with the Village waste collection equipment, in a fashion satisfactory to the Village."
  - -Section III (1), change existing Section III(1) numbering to Section III(1) (a); and re-word as follows:
  - "Subject to Section III(1)(b), all solid waste ...."
  - -Section III(1)(b), add new Section III(1)(b) to read as follows:
  - "Notwithstanding the above Section III(1)(a), waste placed out for collection in non-residential receptacles shall be collected by the Village. Fees for such collection shall be as outlined in Schedule "A" attached to this By-Law."

-Section IV(5), change to read as follows:

"... contained within Village garbage bags, or within approved non-residential receptacles, and placed out for collection, ....".

-Schedule "A", Solid Waste Fees & Charges, add the following:

# "Non-Residential Receptacle

Per Collection

\$10.00 per cubic yard/\$12.50 per cubic metre, based on the manufacturer's specifications for receptacle size. Fee applies regardless of whether bin is full or not.
